

Things you can do to revise for Literature

1. Re-read all of your texts (AIC, all poems, Macbeth & A Christmas Carol)

- full script of AIC attached to classcharts

- Power & Conflict poems: re-read your anthology!

2. Watch the film versions where possible again - Any versions are better than not watching them at all

3. Learn all quotations from your Knowledge Organisers & quotation sheets

4. Identify methods (ideally multiple methods) per quotation/reference

5. Turn your annotation workbooks into posters with words and images

6. Copy out your KOs - or transform them onto one large poster

7. Make flashcards - with questions on the front and answers on the back. Test yourself regularly.

8. Watch Youtube clips and make notes in your pink books
